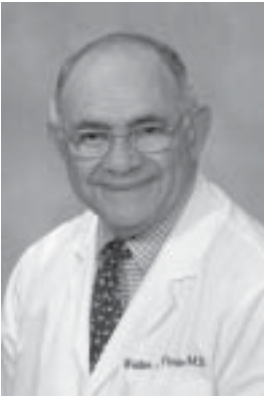

WALTER J. PORIES, M.D.



Walter Pories, MD is professor of surgery and biochemistry at East Carolina University in Greenville, North Carolina. At Wesleyan, Dr. Pories was member of Beta Theta Pi and participated on the soccer and swimming teams.

Dr. Pories is a national leader in surgical research and education. While pursuing his MD with Honors degree at the University of Rochester, he participated in the discovery that zinc is an essential element for animal and, later, human nutrition. He expanded these studies over the next three decades to develop technologies for the study of other trace elements, formulation of oral and intra-venous nutritional supplements, and the setting of nutritional standards. His studies in nutrition continued with his leadership in the development of surgery for obesity and the first demonstration that the gastric bypass operation provides a full, durable remission of adult onset diabetes with a reduction of mortality and morbidity, a discovery that changed our paradigm of that disease to one of greater hope. His contributions were noted with his recent designation as the Principal Investigator for the NIDDK Bariatric Surgery Clinical Center at East Carolina University.

Dr. Pories contributions in surgical education include the development of the first national surgical curriculum for the residency in surgery, the editorship of *Current Surgery*, membership on the Residency Review Committee, and presidency of the Association of Program Directors. He has also been recognized twice for his activism for the education of African-American surgeons.

Dr. Pories was recently honored with the O. Max Gardner Award, given for service to humanity to one faculty member in the North Carolina 16-University System.

Dr. Pories hobbies include painting, cartooning, and working his orchard. He is married to Dr. Mary Ann Rose, Special Assistant to the Chancellor of East Carolina University. They have six children and live on a farm with cattle, goats, guinea hens, geese, pets and various forms of wildlife.

PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

This program is designed for practicing surgeons involved in the diagnosis and treatment of diseases by endosurgical and standard surgical techniques as well as the management of post-operative patients. Themes of the conference include (1) bariatric surgery; (2) the role of the sentinel lymph node in the staging of cancer; and (3) management of melanoma.

Program Objectives & Outcomes:

- ✓ The learner can be expected to define morbid obesity; discuss the obesity epidemic and its effect on health; review the surgical approaches to morbid obesity and their outcomes; understand the special requirements of the bariatric surgery patients; appreciate the need for additional training to become a bariatric surgeon.
- ✓ To understand the role of bariatric surgery in controlling other disease processes; to understand the different surgical procedures available and their role in a bariatric program; to understand the screening and pre-operative evaluation process necessary before a bariatric procedure; to understand the importance of postoperative follow-up of bariatric patients and the operation specific complications that may occur; to understand the training required before performing bariatric procedures; to understand the credentialing and malpractice insurance issues associated with bariatric surgical programs.
- ✓ Surgical residents from the various training programs in Virginia will report on their current scientific and clinical research.
